Jāzeps Vītols Latvian Academy of Music Regulations on changing the source of funding for studies

1. General provisions

- 1.1. The Jāzeps Vītols Latvian Academy of Music Regulations on changing the source of funding for studies (hereinafter the Regulations) have been developed on the basis of the rights and responsibilities of a higher education institution regarding the quality of education, purposeful and rational use of financial and material resources as specified in Section 4 *Higher Education Institution Autonomy* of the Higher Education Institution Law, Cabinet Regulation No. 70 of 23.01.2007 *Mandatory regulations to be included in a study agreement*, and the requirements and the references to the procedure of changing the sources of study funding included in study agreements of Jāzeps Vītols Latvian Academy of Music (hereinafter JVLAM).
- 1.2. The Regulations shall determine the process of student rotation¹ at the JVLAM, including: the procedure of study quality assessment and the criteria as a result of which a student gains or loses a study place as financed by the state budget, the composition of the study quality assessment board and the procedure for its establishment, as well as the obligations and rights of the JVLAM and students.
- 1.3. The rotation procedure set out in the Regulations shall apply to students of the first-level professional higher education study programme, professional bachelor study programmes, professional master study programmes, academic master study programmes, academic doctoral study programmes and joint professional doctoral study programmes of the JVLAM, if the programme has at least one study place financed by the state budget, except for:

- 1.3.1. for students of the JVLAM who, as part of an exchange programme, study at a foreign higher education institution for the entire academic year or for the second semester of the academic year;
- 1.3.2. Deleted.

- 1.4. The Regulations are not applicable to students of the JVLAM studying in the Paid Study Department, the Continuing Education Department, foreign students studying in the JVLAM under the exchange programme and foreign students for whom a fixed source of funding is stipulated by external laws and regulations.
- 1.5. The Regulations are available in the library's book section and on the JVLAM website.

¹ Rotation - the order in which the competition for study places funded by the state budget takes place at the JVLAM.

2. Study quality assessment period

2.1. The evaluation of the quality of studies of the students of the JVLAM, which results in the determination of the change of the source of study funding in the rotation order, shall take place at the end of each academic year (see the study calendar of the 2nd semester of each academic year) within no more than one month after the last week of the academic year (except in the cases mentioned in Paragraphs 2.3 2.3.¹) for the following phases of one academic year of study:

2.1.1. for studying a first-level professional higher education study programme in semesters 1 and 2;

- 2.1.2. for studying a professional master's and academic master's study programmes in semesters 1 and 2;
- 2.1.3. for studying an academic doctoral programme or for the completion of the joint professional doctoral programme *Arts*, sub-programme *Music and Performing Arts*, in semesters 1 and 2, semesters 3 and 4.

2.2. For students who have been matriculated for continuation of studies in later study phases and whose evaluation of completion of the study programme is only for one semester, the committee shall use the evaluation criteria of one semester of studies for the ranking of study results in rotation order. For students who have been matriculated for continuation of studies in later study phases and whose evaluation of the study programme completion is for both semesters, the committee shall use the evaluation criteria of both semesters of studies for the ranking of study results in rotation order.

- 2.3. If a student has been granted permission (in accordance with the procedure established by the JVLAM) to take an examination for the first time after the last working day of the 1st or 2nd semester of the academic year due to a health condition or other justifiable reason (except for the case when permission has been granted to retake an examination), the evaluation of the quality of the JVLAM students' studies, which results in determining the change of the study funding source in rotation, shall take place by 15 October. In such a case, the evaluation of the quality of studies of the students of the JVLAM, which results in the rotation of the source of study funding, shall take place for all students in the relevant target group (subject to the target groups defined in Section 3.2) and may also affect the source of funding for other students in the relevant target group.
- 2.3.¹ The evaluation of the quality of studies of students enrolled in the winter session of the joint professional doctoral study programme "Arts" of the JVLAM, which results in the determination of the change of the study funding source in the rotation order, shall take place within one month after the last week of the autumn semester (or the 1st semester)

for the study of the professional doctoral study programme in the 1st and 2nd semesters, 3rd and 4th semesters.

- 2.4. The evaluation of the quality of studies of the students of the JVLAM, which results in the determination of the change of the source of study funding without applying the rotation procedure, takes place within one month after the end of the 1st semester (see the study calendar of the 1st semester of each academic year), based on the records in the Progress Sheet. As a result of this evaluation of the quality of studies, a decision may be made to transfer a student from a study place financed by the state budget to a study place for tuition fee if the student has not fulfilled the requirements of the semester study programme by the last day of the semester without a justifiable reason.
- 2.5. The evaluation of the quality of studies of students enrolled in the winter session of the joint professional doctoral study programme "Arts" of the JVLAM, which results in the determination of the change of the study funding source without applying the rotation procedure, takes place within one month after the end of the spring semester (or 2nd semester) on the basis of entries in the Progress Sheet. As a result of this evaluation of the quality of studies, a decision may be made to transfer a student from a study place financed by the state budget to a study place for tuition fee if the student has not fulfilled the requirements of the semester study programme by the last day of the semester without a justifiable reason.

3. Target groups and criteria for assessing the quality of studies

- 3.1. The quality of students' studies shall be assessed by level and type of study programme separately for each specific study programme/sub-programme/specialisation, taking into account the target groups referred to in Paragraph 3.2. The number of study places financed by the state budget shall be determined in accordance with the number of study places financed by the state budget approved by the Ministry of Education and Science for each year, the agreement on the training of a certain number of specialists concluded between the Ministry of Culture and the Rector of Jāzeps Vītols Latvian Academy of Music, as well as the state budget allocation approved in the Cabinet Regulation *On the Procedure for Financing Universities and Colleges from State Budget Funds*.
- 3.2. The following target groups of students are identified for the assessment of the quality of studies:

3.3. Within each target group, students shall be assessed separately at each of the stages of study defined in Sub-paragraph 2.1 or 2.3.1, except for target groups No 8 and No 29,

where students shall be assessed uniformly at all stages of study defined in Sub-paragraph 2.1.

- 3.4. Students who, in accordance with the Jāzeps Vītols Latvian Academy of Music Regulations on organising study course examinations and assessing the competence of students, have fulfilled the study programme requirements by the last working day of the 1st and 2nd semester study calendar of the current academic year, have successfully passed the semester examinations in all study courses (or thematic parts of study courses) scheduled at the JVLAM within the allotted time, and have acquired the amount of credit points scheduled in the programme, may apply for study places financed by the state budget.
- 3.5. A student who, in accordance with the *Jāzeps Vītols Latvian Academy of Music Regulations on organising study course examinations and assessing the competence of students*, has not fulfilled all academic obligations for the semester by the last working day of the 1st or 2nd semester study calendar of the current academic year without a justifiable reason shall lose the right to continue studies within a state budget-funded study place in the following semester.
 - 3.5.1. If it is established that there are objective reasons for why the student has not fulfilled the academic obligations of the semester, the Board shall be entitled to decide on the continuation of the studies in the state-budget funded study place.
- 3.6. If a student has been granted permission by the JVLAM to take an examination for the first time after the last working day of the 1st or 2nd semester of the academic year due to a health condition or other justifiable reason (except for the case when permission has been granted to retake an examination), the student's source of funding shall not be changed until the examination has been taken and the quality of studies shall be assessed within the period specified in Section 2.3. In the case provided for in this Paragraph, if the student has fulfilled the requirements of the study programme, successfully passed the semester examinations in all study courses (or thematic parts of study courses) provided for in the study programme, and fulfilled the amount of credit points planned in the programme by the time of the study quality assessment, in accordance with the Jāzeps Vītols Latvian Academy of Music Regulations on organising study course examinations and assessing the competence of students, within the time limit agreed with JVLAM, they may apply for a study place financed by the state budget. The procedure set out in this paragraph shall not apply to students who started their studies after the winter session.

- 3.7.4. If two or more students have the same grade, the highest grade obtained in the specialisation or priority course or thematic unit examination is taken into account;
- 3.7.5. If several students with the same basic criteria (criteria 3.7.1, 3.7.4) apply for one study place, the following study indicators are taken into account:
 - 3.7.5.1. attitude towards studies (including students not having received the disciplinary sanction stipulated in Paragraph 7.1 of the *Internal Regulations* for Students of the JVLAM);
 - 3.7.5.2. creative/artistic activities.

5. Composition and competences of the Study Quality Assessment Board

- 5.1. The evaluation of the quality of students' studies shall be carried out by the Study Quality Assessment Board approved by the Rector's order, which shall consist of:
 - 5.1.1. the Rector as the Board's Chair;
 - 5.1.2. the Vice-Rector for Academic Affairs as the Board's Vice-Chair;
 - 5.1.3. the Vice-Rector for Research and Creative Activities
 - 5.1.4. the Head of Study Direction;
 - 5.1.5. at least two members of the Student Self-Government Board;

- 5.1.6. the head of the relevant department and the director of the study programme;
- 5.1.7. the heads of the departments involved in the implementation of the relevant *study programme/sub-programme/specialisation* or profile.
- 5.2. Duties and rights of the board:
 - 5.2.1. To assess and rank the student's academic performance in accordance with the procedure laid down in the Regulations, within the framework of the rotation process, and to decide on a proposal to change or maintain the source of funding on the basis of the entries made in the student's Academic Progress Sheets;
 - 5.2.2. For students who have started their studies after enrolment in the summer session, after the end of the 1st semester, on the basis of the records in the Progress Report, to evaluate the results of the student's semester studies, and to make a decision on the transfer of the student from the state budget-funded study place to study for tuition fee, if the student has not fulfilled the semester study programme requirements by the last day of the semester without a justifiable reason.

- 5.2.5. to provide the student with the opportunity to review the decision to change or maintain the source of funding;

- 5.3. The decision of the board on the sources of funding for studies and the change of sources shall be confirmed by an order of the Rector. Within three working days from the date of signature of the order, the contents of the order shall be personally communicated to each student. A student who has familiarised themselves with the content of the Rector's order and disagrees with it has the right to submit an appeal to the Academic Arbitration Court of the JVLAM within three working days regarding the detected irregularities in the process of evaluation of study results.
- 5.4. The proceedings and decisions of the boards hall be recorded in the minutes of its meetings. The minutes of the meetings of the board shall be kept in accordance with the requirements of the JVLAM Nomenclature of Cases.

6. Entry into force of changes to the source of funding for the student's studies and changes to the study agreement

6.1. For a student who has started their studies after enrolment in the summer session, the change of the source of funding shall take effect from the first day of the academic calendar of the first semester (or autumn semester) of each academic year if the decision to change the source of funding has been taken as part of the rotation process (in accordance with Paragraph 5.2.1 of the Regulations). For a student who has commenced their studies after enrolment during the winter examination session, the change of the source of funding shall take effect on the first day of the 2nd semester (spring semester) of each academic year, if the decision to change the source of funding is taken as part of the rotation process (in accordance with Paragraph 5.2.1 of the Regulations)÷;

- 6.2. A change of the source of funding of a student's studies shall take effect from the first day of the academic calendar of each semester, if the decision to change the source of funding is taken in accordance with Paragraph 5.2.2 or 5.2.2.1 of the Regulations;

- 6.3. A change in the source of funding for a student's studies is an amendment to the study agreement mutually concluded between the JVLAM and the student, which, taking into account the requirements of the Study Agreement, must be mutually signed within the time limit set in the agreement.
- 6.4. The details of the change of the source of funding for the studies shall be included by the Secretary of the Study Department in the amendments to the Study Agreement, and the student must confirm their consent (or disagreement) to the amendments by signing the Study Agreement within the time limit specified in the Study Agreement.

- 6.5. A student who does not sign the Study Agreement amendments regarding the change of the source of study funding shall be expelled.
- 6.6. A student who, as a result of the evaluation of the quality of their studies, has obtained the right to study in a budget place but wishes to continue their studies at their own personal expense, shall write an application to withdraw from the budget place.
- 6.7. If a student has paid the full semester tuition fee but subsequently obtains a budget study place as a result of a study quality assessment, the overpaid part of the tuition fee shall be refunded upon their written application.
- 6.8. Tuition for a student who studies for a fee shall be determined in accordance with the Jāzeps Vītols Latvian Academy of Music Regulations on tuition fees for students who are sponsored by the state budget.

7. Miscellaneous Provisions

- 7.1. The Regulations shall enter into force on 1 September 2018.
- 7.2. Upon the entry into force of the Regulations, the *Jāzeps Vītols Latvian Academy of Music Regulations on the Change of Study Funding Source* approved at the JVLAM Senate meeting on 28 March 2012 (Minutes No.2) shall become invalid.
